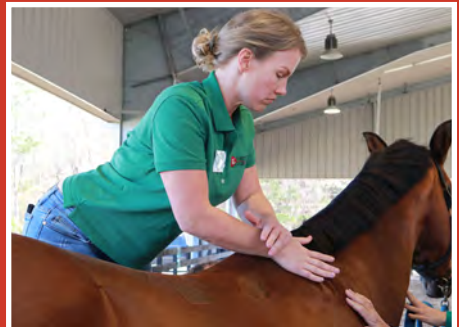
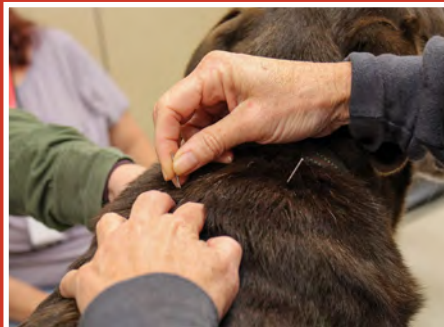

Chi University was founded in 1998 by Dr. Huisheng Xie, a leading clinician and former professor at the University of Florida's College of Veterinary Medicine. Chi University is dedicated to providing premium education to veterinarians and veterinary students in integrative and Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine (TCVM) modalities. Chi University is accredited by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), the Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC), and the Florida Commission for Independent Education. Its main campus is located near Ocala, Florida, the horse capital of the world. In addition, Chi has campuses in 25 other countries and regions. After more than 20 years of development, Chi University is a global leader in integrative veterinary medicine education and is referred to as "the Harvard of TCVM" by its students.





Integrative veterinary medicine (IVM) is a combination of Western veterinary medicine and holistic medicine practices.

IVM not only includes the diagnosis and treatment technologies of Western medicine, but also various clinically proven veterinary therapies such as acupuncture, herbal medicine, rehabilitation, physical therapy, spinal/joint manipulation, and nutrition. Through the combination of these practices, this refined focus on a systematic and personalized approach to patients results in more diagnosis and treatment options and improved outcomes.

As the demand for IVM continues to grow, many pet owners wish to provide all-encompassing health protection for their pets, extensively exploring alternative therapies to improve the quality of life for their animals. At the same time, an increasing number of studies have validated the effectiveness of many alternative therapies, providing a scientific basis for IVM as well as promoting acceptance in mainstream veterinary practice.



IVM services are now offered at a number of universities and private pet clinics in the United States. By joining Chi University's Integrative Veterinary Medicine Summer

Program, you will gain hands-on experience at veterinary teaching hospitals, allowing you to gain exposure to the latest advancements in the field and strengthen language skills, which are essential for research, communication, and practicing in international settings.

Dr. Huisheng Xie DVM, PhD

Dr. Huisheng Xie is an experienced professional with extensive academic accomplishments. He is the founder of Chi University and also served as a clinical professor at UF's College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Xie has received achievement awards from several major institutions including the China Ministry of Agriculture, the National Science and Technology Committee, Beijing Agricultural University, the Chinese Veterinary Medicine Association, the Chinese Association of Traditional Veterinary Science, the World Association of TCVM, and the American Holistic Veterinary Medical Association. CBS News referred to him as "a leading authority in animal acupuncture." Not to mention, he is an honorary professor and director of the International Institute of Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine of South China Agricultural University and China Southwest University. Dr. Xie has authored more than 30 books and has had over 100 papers published in peer-reviewed veterinary medical journals. His textbooks, including *Xie's Veterinary Herbology*, *Xie's Veterinary Acupuncture*, and *Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine: Fundamental Principles*, have been used for TCVM training courses around the world. He has lectured around the world, speaking in the USA, Canada, Japan, Thailand, Indonesia, South Korea, Australia, Mexico, Brazil, Europe, and South Africa and trained over 11,000 veterinarians to practice TCVM worldwide.



Dr. Mushtaq Memon BVSc, PhD, DACT, CVA

Dr. Mushtaq Memon is a Professor Emeritus at Washington State University (WSU) and Executive Director of the World Association of Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Memon is a specialist in Veterinary Reproduction (Theriogenology) and is a Diplomate of the American College of Theriogenologists. Before joining WSU, he was a faculty member at the Veterinary Colleges of Oklahoma State Univ, Louisiana State Univ, and Tufts Univ. Dr. Memon is an internationally recognized scholar and has served as a Fulbright Scholar, visiting professor, consultant, or volunteer in 28 countries to enhance education standards and assist smallholder farmers in increasing food production in developing countries. Dr. Memon was a founding faculty member of the Paul Allen School for Global Health at WSU. He is also the author of over 120 publications in refereed journals, conference proceedings, and the co-editor of 3 books. His recent book on integrative veterinary medicine was published in 2023.

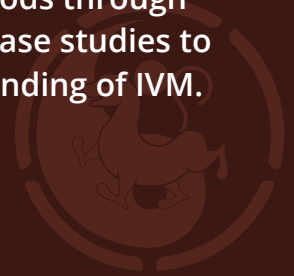

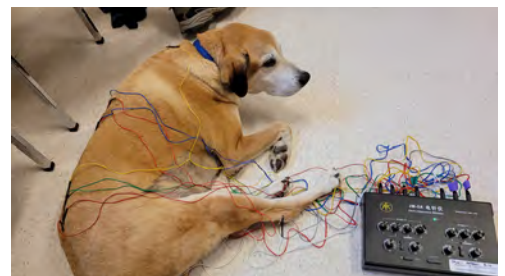
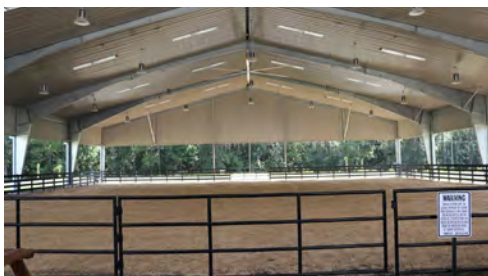


Small Animal Hospital

By focusing on integrative medicine, Chi Animal Hospital leverages the advantages of both Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine and Western veterinary medicine to provide the highest level of diagnostic and treatment services for animals. The small animal hospital offers a variety of services, including diagnosis and treatment, preventive immunization, physical exams, and tests. The large animal hospital features 12 equine examination rooms, a 12,500-square-foot arena, and a spacious, comfortable waiting area. Chi Animal Hospital serves as a vital platform for teaching and practical training, enhancing clinical skills, teaching quality, and educational outcomes for faculty. It has become a significant educational and practical institution.

Established in July 1962, it is one of the most important places for NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) to test, prepare, and conduct spacecraft for launch.
