Survey on income and living conditions

Your household has been selected for Statistics Finland's survey – participating is easy!

- The survey is conducted **by interviewing** you or some other member of your household **by telephone**.
- Please wait for our call or set up a time for an interview with your statistical interviewer (contact details above).
- One person from each household is selected for the survey, but other household members can also take part in supplying information.

The survey collects data on the development of living conditions in Finland. The same households are included in the survey for four years in a row. The survey is carried out once a year.



We will ensure your data protection

Responding is confidential

Statistics Finland is a government statistical agency, which produces statistics and conducts surveys describing conditions in society.

Grounds for processing personal data

Public interest as intended in the EU's General Data Protection Regulation.

Data to be combined with the collected data

To reduce the response burden, the collected data are supplemented with register data. The data are combined with demographic data available to Statistics Finland on household members (e.g. sex, age and education). Data describing income (e.g. pensions, wages and salaries, entrepreneurial income, social security benefits), taxation, assets and indebtedness are combined from the data of the Tax Administration, the Finnish Centre for Pensions and the Social Insurance institution of Finland, as well as data on wealth from the Finnish Transport and Communications Agency's registers. In future, data on employment and health can also be combined to the data for research purposes. The data are processed so that your household cannot be identified from the completed statistical data.

Source for contact information

Publicly available sources, Statistics Finland's database based on the Population Information System and those registers of authorities from which data are obtained based on the Statistics Act.

Disclosure of data

Statistics Finland never releases the data received by it to other authorities in a manner that would allow identification of the individuals having participated in the survey.

- We handle your responses in a confidential manner.
- Statistics Finland's employees are obliged to secrecy.
- We use the data you have given for compiling statistics concerning living conditions, income distribution and households' assets.
- The data are also used in the European Union's Survey on income and living conditions.
- Some of the data are released to the Bank of Finland for the Eurosystem Household Finance and Consumption Survey.
- It is not possible to identify persons having participated in the survey from the statistical data.
- Statistical data can be released for statistical surveys and scientific research.



The data are processed so that you cannot be identified from the completed statistical data.

Contact information will not be released outside Statistics Finland.

Survey results benefit us all

The survey collects data on people's everyday life and matters related to their livelihood, such as housing, access to health services, children's day care, loans and sufficiency of income.

Based on the responses, we compile official statistics describing living conditions and livelihood in Finland.

The statistics will indicate how many people in Finland are at risk of poverty or social exclusion and what income differentials are like in Finland compared to other European countries. Data are collected from small pieces

Participation is a civil right. Your responses are utilised when preparing decisions that affect us all. By participating you help to ensure that decision-makers and central government have a view of Finnish society that is based on the right kind of information. All people benefit from this.

We want to ensure that all those selected randomly to the survey are given the opportunity to participate

Around 12,000 households in Finland have been selected randomly for the survey. Your household represents around 300 other households in your area and age group. If we cannot reach you or other members of your household by telephone, we can also contact you by visiting your home address.

Statistics Finland has conducted the Survey on income and living conditions since 2004. Surveys with the same content are carried out annually in over 30 European countries. The survey results are internationally comparable.
