

Membership criteria - the Offshore Wind Foundations Alliance (OWFA)

Companies wishing to join OWFA may request to become a member. The annual membership fee is split equally between the members and varies with the level of activity undertaken within a given year.

Applications will be assessed on an individual basis by OWFA's board. As a minimum, applicants should:

- **Produce offshore wind foundations** (floating or bottom-fixed) or transition pieces in the European Union (EU) with a proven record of minimum 3 offshore wind projects completed as main fabricator
 - A project is defined as a serial project to supply an offshore wind farm that generates a minimum of 300 MW. Qualifying destination projects can be located outside of the EU (e.g., in the UK)
- Have an established physical manufacturing presence in the EU and a large foundation or transition piece fabrication site in the EU with an overall capacity of at least 100 foundations or transition pieces per year.
- Be aligned with OWFA's goal:
 - Ensure that the voice of this important industry is amplified, and that legislation not only takes into account but also promotes policies that enable a level playing field and standards that benefit the industry.
- Demonstrate a minimum of 3 years of applying the following management system certifications:

ISO 9001	Quality Management
ISO 14001	Environmental Management
ISO 45001	Health and Safety Management
ISO 50001	or any equivalent energy management solution in place by 2025 at the latest
