<u>Monterey County Superior Court – COVID 19 Safety Protocol</u>

Monterey County Superior Court

All Court Locations

Signage:

Signage has been posted at the public entrance of each facility to inform all employees and customers that they should:

- ☑ avoid entering the facility if they have a cough or fever;
- maintain a minimum six-foot distance from one another as you enter the facility;
- wear a face mask (**required**);
- sneeze and cough into a cloth or tissue or, if not available, into one's elbow; and
- do not shake hands or engage in any unnecessary physical contact.

Signage on Social Distancing requirements has been posted at each public entrance and inside of each Court facility.

Measures To Protect Employee Health:

- Everyone who can carry out their work duties from home has been directed to do so.
- ☑ All employees are asked not to come to work if sick.
- Prior to arriving at the courthouse, all individuals, including employees should conduct a self- assessment of their health and should stay home if they have **any** of the following symptoms:
 - Fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or greater
 - Cough
 - Sore Throat
 - Shortness of breath
- If All desks or individual work stations are being separated by at least six feet.
- Break rooms, bathrooms, and other common areas are being disinfected at a minimum of twice a day.
- Disinfectant and related supplies are available to all employees from the Court's General

It is the mission of the Monterey County Superior Court to serve the public in a respectful, courteous and efficient manner promoting trust and confidence in the legal system by providing fair, equal and open access to justice.

Services division.

- Hand sanitizer effective against COVID-19 is available to all employees from the Court's General Services division.
- Soap and water are available to all employees in all restrooms and employee break rooms.

☑ Via prior CEO communication, all employees and security teams have been asked to follow Safety protocols.

Measures To Prevent Crowds From Gathering:

Security protocols have been posted at the door to ensure that the maximum number of people in the facility do not exceed a number that could compromise social distancing.

- Attorneys are asked to wait outside the courtroom until their case is called.
- When necessary, a limited number of in custody defendants are brought into the courtroom following the social distancing policies.
- When possible, arraignments are being conducted by Video-Conferencing.
- Bailiffs and Entrance Screening security personnel enforce the social distancing policies.

Measures To Keep People At Least Six Feet Apart:

- Placing signs outside the Courthouse reminding people to be at least six feet apart, including when in line.
- Placing tape or other markings at least six feet apart in visitor waiting areas including public entrances.
- All employees have been instructed to maintain at least six feet distance from customers and from each other.

Measures To Increase Sanitization in all Court facilities:

- ☑ Disinfecting wipes that are effective against COVID-19 are available near desks and work spaces.
- Hand sanitizer, soap and water, or effective disinfectant is available to the public at or near the entrance of the facility, courtrooms, staff areas and anywhere people have direct interactions.
- Disinfecting all high-contact touch-point surfaces at a minimum of twice a day.
