We also took the time to highlight the 8 to 80 Legends Zone we have been selected to develop on the Long Beach State campus. The Zone will also include a permanent home for BOSS and provide an amazing and unique tool to address the lack of significant numbers of BIPOC students pursuing careers in STEM disciplines, and the reluctance of boys of color, in particular, to pursue STEM careers resulting from a lack of preparation, confidence, resources, and supports.

BOSS scholars along with a couple of other groups participating in The Alliance (5-year effort of the 11 Southern CA-based pro sports franchises to expose student-athletes to non-playing career opportunities in sport) visited the LA Coliseum for a behind-the-scenes look at NASCAR and the business of auto racing on February 6, 2022. The event preceded NASCAR's Clash event, the annual preseason exhibition event before the season kicks off with the Daytona 500.

The behind-the-scenes look at the business of auto racing included a conversation with Emmy Award-winning producer Artie Kempner and Jamie Little, the first female play-by-play TV

announcer of a national Motorsports series, and an up-close and personal look at a live television set. They also got to speak with Fox industry veterans, learning how to use their skills and talents to break into media production and on-air careers. Our BOSS scholars were also treated to a personal tour of the NASCAR track including conversations around the engineering and architectural aspects of racetrack construction, maintenance, and car safety by Jusan Hamilton, Race Director & Director, Racing Operations & Event Management at NASCAR. We finished the day off with a panel discussion with NASCAR's diversity team, led by Senior Manager, Multicultural & Youth Marketing Erica Wilkerson, learning about their careers, journeys, and challenges they have overcome in the sport. Foster Care Alumni: A Story of Humility and Resilience

Tyson Frank

Tyson Frank is not only a role model to young boys of the <u>B.O.S.S.</u> (<u>Business of Student Success</u>) <u>Program</u>, but he is an intelligent, humble, resilient, compassionate, and ambitious young man.

Before being placed into foster care around age 11, he experienced Hurricane Katrina. The trauma from an event like that is unforgettable, but not enough to stop prevent Tyson from continuing to do his best in school. As a result of the hurricane, his family relocated to Texas and eventually California.



Despite some of the challenges his family faced, which later resulted in him being placed into foster care, he managed to keep his grades up because it was instilled in him at an early age that his education was a priority. Shortly before he turned 11 years old, Tyson and his siblings were placed into foster care in Northern California. They were separated, and he went back and forth between foster and group homes for a while.
