Dr. Power received her Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery from Murdoch University in 1999 and began her veterinary career in general practice, as well as various emergency and critical care hospitals in Australia and the United Kingdom. When she discovered how much TCM enriched her own life, she decided to pursue this path in her veterinary career and earned a certification in veterinary acupuncture in 2013, followed by completion of the veterinary *tui-na* (veterinary medical massage) course at Chi University. Dr. Power's veterinary clinic specializes in TCVM treatment of small animal patients using acupuncture, herbal medicine, food therapy, tuina and exercise therapy. During this time, Dr. Power earned a Bachelor Degree in acupuncture and is now practicing TCM and TCVM in her clinic in Adelaide, Australia. In 2014, she joined Chi Australia as an administrator and, in 2015, became Director of Chi Australia. Dr. Power is dedicated to sharing her passion for TCVM with all current and future veterinary acupuncturists.

Dr. Cadena earned her DMV in Ecuador in 2013. Her career led her to the Galapagos where she focused on public health and canine physiotherapy, then on to Australia where she turned her attention to her true interest: canine behaviour and holistic medicine based in traditional Chinese approaches. John Katakasi BVSc (HONS), CVA, CVCHM



Dr. John Katakasi graduated with his BVSc and 2nd class honours from the University of Sydney in 1995. Dr. Katakasi became interested in learning about Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine (TCVM) while attending a lecture where treatments using acupuncture were presented. Through self-study, he began reading to understand acupuncture points and the TCVM treatment approach. The benefits for treating and preventing injuries as well as maintaining performance became clear and directly supported Dr. Katakasi's interest in physical conditioning and exercise physiology due to his lifelong involvement with elite level horse and greyhound racing. Dr. Katakasi received certifications and College of Integrative Veterinary Therapies in veterinary acupuncture (International Veterinary Acupuncture Society, 2009) and Chinese veterinary herbal medicine (International Veterinary Acupuncture Society & College of Integrative Veterinary Therapies, 2010). Dr. Katakasi's specialized TCVM approach has resulted in significantly more efficient, effective treatment producing better patient outcomes in less time.

CVA PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The course begins with an overview of fundamental aspects of Chinese Medicine, including *Yin-Yang* and Five Elements theory, which serve as a foundation for case diagnoses and treatment presented later in the class. A variety of acupuncture techniques are taught, including electro-acupuncture, aquaacupuncture, moxibustion, etc. in addition to conventional "dry" needling. In acupoint labs, students learn acupuncture points on live dogs.

Chi's hands-on acupoint labs and low student-to-instructor ratio ensure you gain the confidence to start practicing acupuncture after the first on-site session.

The course is presented in 2 online sessions and 2 hybrid sessions. Hybrid sessions include two segments: online & onsite. Online segments are comprised of lectures and case demos that students can stream at their own convenience. On-site segments give students the opportunity to learn acupuncture points on live animals in small acupoint lab groups of four to six students per instructor. The on-site portion of this course is located in North Adelaide, Australia.


